

Why screening a pest control company matters in Toronto

Which treatment methods will they use?

Request every company to explain its approach to treatment before you schedule. The best providers use **integrated pest management**, which means they use a combination of inspection, monitoring, targeted

treatment, exclusion, and sanitation recommendations rather than relying only on chemicals. This approach is often stronger for long-term control because it addresses the source of the problem, not just the visible pests.

If you are having trouble with bed bugs, ask whether they offer **bed bug heat treatment Toronto** services or a chemical treatment [pest control](#) plan.
