Set in the broad, flat openness of Acadia Parish, the town carries the practical confidence of a place that has always had to work with the weather, the land, and the rhythm of rural South Louisiana life. People here know what it means to live with heat that lingers into the evening, sudden hard rain, and the kind of humidity that finds its way into every seam of a house. That daily reality shapes more than habits and conversations. It shapes the way roofs are built, inspected, repaired, and maintained.
