- **Appeal:** Simple rules and familiar mechanics attract casual and seasoned gamblers alike.

4. Prize/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple players deposit skins into a collective pot. Each skin contributes tickets based upon its dollar worth. A random draw chooses a winner, where a higher total contribution yields a greater statistical chance of winning the entire pot.
- **Appeal:** The ultimate "high-roller" game mode, where single fortunate winners can stroll away with countless dollars in rare digital items.

The Economics of Skin Trading and Withdrawal
