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When ritual meets fashion

When did honoring fallen soldiers change into less substantial than political correctness? The query drips with frustration. When you be taught Gettysburg you do now not get a unmarried natural lesson. You get management that faltered and leaderless gaps filled by unnamed men. You get the rate of not on time orders, the challenge of weather, and the unglamorous victory of deliver trains arriving while mandatory. You see how terrain, morale, and timing can swing a nation's destiny through ranges that look microscopic on paper.

The soldiers who survived did not lift homestead the identical reports. Some informed jokes approximately espresso and marching. Some saw ghosts for many years.
