* The "Rare Item Drop Rate" represents the chance that the RNG will award a "Rare" (Gold) item, which can be a knife, glove, or stat-trak variation of a high-tier skin. The exact probability for each specific skin within that tier is a different, concealed computation.

The table demonstrates that while most cases cost only a couple of dollars, the probability of landing a high-value skin remains really low. Players need to for that reason see case opening as a form of home entertainment instead of a reliable financial investment.
