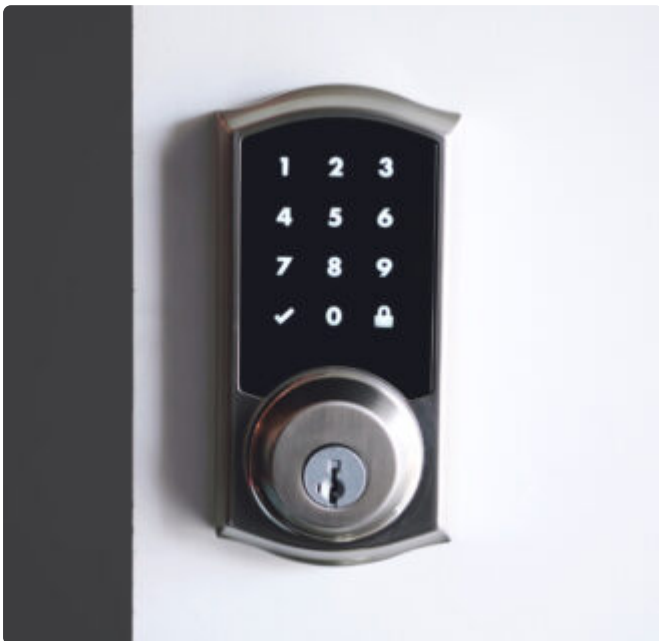
The quiet art of translating a lock
