- **Stickers--** Popular competition sticker labels, specifically those from major events, can add substantial worth.
- **Historic Events--** Skins connected to champion groups (e.g., "Cologne" sticker labels) often appreciate after the occasion.

While some skins have actually seen returns going beyond 1,000% over a couple of years, the marketplace is unpredictable. Costs can plummet after a case release or a market manipulation wave.
