Example Cost Structure

To illustrate the economics of a common 10-person battle, think about a lobby that uses the "Gamma 2" case (\approx £ 2.30 per case). Each participant purchases one case, so the total pot is £ 23.00. The platform takes a 5% commission (£ 1.15), leaving £ 21.85 to be distributed as follows:

In practice, payouts vary commonly since the skins dropped can be worth anywhere from a couple of cents to several hundred dollars.

Top 5 Tips for Beginners

1. **Start Small**-- Choose low-cost cases (e.g., CS: GO Weapon Case, Operation Bravo) to familiarise yourself with the circulation without risking big bankrolls.
