MPL: train for airline-style procedures from the start

An MPL, or Multi-Crew Pilot Certificate, is more directly lined up to airline company operations. Your resistance for unpredictability matters more than most people expect

A surprisingly typical reality is that prospects ignore just how much mental energy uncertainty expenses. You can be practically solid and still feel drained pipes if completion objective is vague.

AELO's MPL program being called including a task assurance is relevant because it alters what you worry about. With MPL, a big portion of "what happens after training" is addressed up front, at the very least in terms of the work end result being assured in the program description.
