On other days, we're unserious. We flatten records into content. We commerce honor for an argument. We cut back wars to hashtags and factors to cartoons. Then we get stressed why the thoughts believe thin, why young Americans tune out the older ones who dialogue most effective in absolutes, why veterans both clam up or converse in a baritone we now not trust.
