## Advanced Solutions for Persistent Crashes

## 1. Adjusting Launch Options

- Open Steam Library > > Right-click CS: GO > > Properties > General.
- In the **Launch Options** field, attempt adding:
  - -autoconfig (Resets video and performance settings to default)
  - -nod3d9ex (Disables an older DirectX extension that sometimes triggers conflicts)
  - -threads [number] (Forces the game to use a specific number of CPU cores)

## 2. Keeping Track Of Hardware Temperatures and Overclocks

Pushing hardware beyond factory limitations through overclocking (CPU, GPU, or RAM) can cause instability in requiring source-engine games.

- Use tracking software like HWMonitor or MSI Afterburner to check temperature levels while playing.
- If temperatures surpass 85 ° C, clear out dust filters and make sure appropriate air flow.
- Temporarily revert any factory overclocks or XMP profiles to check if system stability enhances.

## 3. Reinstalling Visual C++ and DirectX

Numerous game crashes occur because the Windows os lacks the required runtime libraries needed to execute game scripts.

- Browse to the video game's installation folder: Steam \ steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive \ \_ CommonRedist
- Run the installers located inside the vcredist and DirectX folders to repair or update vital system files.
