Consumer Grade (White)	N/A	Base weapons, rarely discovered in basic cases.
Industrial Grade (Light Blue)	79.92%	The most typical drop; frequently referred to as "blues."
Mil-Spec (Dark Blue)	15.98%	Common drops, somewhat greater value than blues.
Restricted (Purple)	3.20%	Uncommon products, typically the budget-friendly favorites.
Classified (Pink)	0.64%	Rare items; typically high-tier weapon surfaces.
Covert (Red)	0.16%	Extremely uncommon; flagship weapon skins for the case.
Unique Item (Gold)	0.26%	The jackpot tier, consisting of knives or gloves.

Keep in mind: There is roughly a 10% possibility for any dropped product to feature the StatTrak™ technology, which cuts the base odds of that specific product in half once again.

Drift Values and Wear Conditions

Landing an uncommon red or gold skin is just half the battle. When an item is won, its visual quality is identified by its **Float Value**-- a number between 0.00 and 1.00 that dictates wear and tear.

Players ought to familiarize themselves with the five official wear categories:

1. **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Pristine, minimal scratches)
2. **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Slight blemishes or use on edges)
3. **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable scratches and dullness)

4. **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear and texture loss)

5. **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Extremely worn, sometimes dramatically modifying the skin's look)

Some skins actually look better or maintain their worth well in Field-Tested condition, while others plummet in price if they aren't Factory New.

The Economics: Opening Cases vs. Buying Singles

From a simply monetary standpoint, opening CS2 cases is usually a losing proposal. Due to the fact that the expected value (EV) of a case is lower than the combined cost of the case and the key, your house (Valve) constantly wins in the long run.

To put this into viewpoint, think about the following comparison:



- **The Case Opening Route:**

- **Pros:** The excitement of the gamble, the small possibility of striking a high-tier knife, and the fun of unboxing a self-mined product.
- **Cons:** High financial danger, statistically guaranteed long-lasting losses, and the high possibility of receiving low-tier "blue" products worth pennies.

For gamers on a spending plan, **buying skins from the Steam Community Market or credible third-party markets is generally advised.** Nevertheless, for those who see case opening as a form of entertainment-- similar to buying a lotto ticket or visiting a gambling establishment-- it stays a cherished pastime.

Tips for Responsible CS2 Case Opening
