- **StatTrak™ Technology:** An optional counter developed into the weapon that digitally tape-records the variety of kills the owner attains with it.
- **Keepsake Quality:** Items dropped solely during official Valve-sponsored esports tournaments (Majors), featuring gold sticker labels honoring the match and groups.

The Wear Rating Hierarchy

Comprehending skin wear is important for anyone seeking to buy, sell, or trade. The wear condition is divided into five unique classifications:

Exterior Condition	Drift Value Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Beautiful condition with minimal to no scratches or blemishes.
Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Really light wear, normally small scratches visible only upon close assessment.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Visible wear and tear, scratches on

the body and paint breaking on edges. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, heavy scratching, and visible fading of colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Incredibly used, heavily faded, rusted, or scraped look.

Note: Some skins are "capped," indicating they can not physically drop in Factory New condition due to the fact that of how the texture is configured.

The Economics of the CS2 Marketplace

What separates Counter-Strike from the majority of other video games is its open, player-driven economy. Valve developed a virtual environment where digital items hold real-world worth, sustained by the Steam Community Market and third-party trading platforms.

Elements Driving Skin Prices:

1. **Rarity and Drop Rates:** Just like physical trading cards, the odds of unboxing rare items (like Covert rifles, knives, or gloves) from weapon cases are incredibly low.
2. **Supply and Demand:** If a particular case is no longer dropping in-game, the supply of its included skins ends up being finite, frequently causing rates to rise gradually.
3. **Expert Play (Esports):** When a professional gamer uses a specific skin throughout a major competition, need for that product typically increases overnight.
4. **Trade-Ups:** Players can trade up 10 skins of one rarity tier for one skin of the next higher tier, permanently consuming the input items and changing market products.
