2. **A Cipher/Key:** Purchased in-game for a standard flat rate of £ 2.50 GBP.

How to Get CS2 Cases

Players can get cases primarily through active gameplay, trading, or acquiring them straight. Valve makes use of a specific drop system to regulate the supply of cases in the community.

The Weekly Drop System

Weekly, active-duty players who level up their profile get a care plan where they can choose 2 benefits out of 4 alternatives, which periodically includes a weapon case. Additionally, gamers can receive random drops at the end of matches on main servers.

Active Service vs. Rare Drop Pools

Valve classifies cases into two primary swimming pools:

- **Active Drop Pool:** These cases drop regularly to players currently playing the video game. They usually represent the most recently released collections.
- **Rare (Discontinued) Drop Pool:** These older cases no longer drop routinely after matches. Instead, they have an infinitesimally little possibility of dropping (approximately a 1% opportunity compared to active drops), triggering their market price to appreciate in time.

- **Special Item (Knives/ Gloves):** 0.26% (approximately a 1 in 385 chance)

Furthermore, every product unpacked has a chance to come in a particular **wear condition**, varying from *Factory New* to *Battle-Scarred*. Some items also have a small possibility of being **StatTrak™**, which tracks the number of kills made with that particular weapon.
