portions above represent the "base" chance per opening. The real "Blue Gems" (Gold tier) are exceptionally uncommon, often estimated at less than 0.0001% for specific high-tier knives.



How the Opening Mechanic Works

When a gamer clicks "Unlock," the video game creates a random number. This number associates to a particular product within the case's pool.

Float Value & StatTrak

A crucial consideration determining a skin's worth is its **Float Value**. This is a number between 0 and 1 that represents the wear and tear of the weapon:

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00 - 0.07
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07 - 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15 - 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38 - 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45 - 1.00

In addition, some skins include a **StatTrak**™ counter, tracking the number of eliminates made with that weapon. StatTrak versions are generally more costly than their standard equivalents.

The Most Popular and Valuable Cases

Not all cases are created equal. Older cases, or those containing legendary skins like the "Fade" or "Case Hardened" Blue Gems, command huge prices on the Steam Community Market.

Top 5 Most Expensive Cases

1. **The CS: GO Weapon Case # 1:** The original case. Costs vary greatly but are usually really high due to fond memories.
2. **The eSports 2013 Case:** Contains the renowned Howl.
3. **The Revolver Case:** Contains the R8 Revolver|Fade.
4. **The Operation Wildfire Case:** Introduced the Fire Serpent collection.
5. **The Clutch Case:** Known for valuable Gamma Doppler knives.

- **Average Cost to Open:** £ 3.00 (Key) + £ 0.50 (Case) = **£ 3.50**
- **Typical Return:** Typically hovers around £ 0.80 to £ 1.50, implying your house (Valve) and the market generally profit.

Many players will get "scrap" (Consumer or Mil-Spec skins) worth pennies. However, the adventure of the "roll" and the possibility of landing a Covert or Gold product keeps the economy alive. For financial investment purposes, buying the case straight is frequently more secure than paying for the secret to open it.

You can purchase cases directly from the "Get" area in the CS: GO main menu, or you can acquire them from the Steam Community Market for a variable cost.

4. Do cases disappear if not opened?

No, cases in your stock do not expire. You can keep them forever.

Supply and need. Older cases are <https://cs2skin.com/cases> no longer stopped by the game, making them limited. If they contain a desirable skin (like the R8 Fade), the cost stays high due to rarity.
