The Anatomy of a Finish: What Determines Value?

1. Exterior Wear (Float Value)

Every item drops with a specific "float worth" ranging from **0.00 to 1.00**, which identifies its physical wear and tear. The float is divided into 5 official wear classifications:

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Pristine, minimal scratches)
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Slight imperfections, normally near edges)
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable wear, scratches, or fading)
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear, paint chipping)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Extremely used, often drastically modifying the texture)

Note: Some items look wonderful even in Battle-Scarred condition, while others are valued strictly in Factory New.

2. Product Rarity Tiers

Valve categorizes weapon surfaces into color-coded tiers based on their drop rates in cases or trade-ups.

Rarity Tier Color Code Drop Rate/ Acquisition Method
Consumer Grade White Found in weekly drops/ Base video game
Industrial Grade Light Blue Common drops/ Low-tier case contents
Mil-Spec Dark Blue Requirement case drops
Limited Purple Unusual case drops
Classified Pink Uncommon case drops
Covert Red Extremely uncommon case drops (Top-tier standard weapons)
Exotic/ Special Gold Very unusual (Knives and Gloves)

Patterns and StatTrak™: The Elements of Prestige

Beyond float worths and rarities, two major functions can considerably inflate a product's value: **Pattern Indexes** and **StatTrak™ technology**.

Pattern Templates

Lots of finishes make use of a procedural generation system where a texture template moves across the weapon design based upon a "Paint Seed" (from 1 to 1000). Depending upon the seed number, the visual appearance can alter completely.

- **Case Hardened:** Famous for its blue and gold circulations. A pattern with a high portion of solid blue on top can command 10s of thousands of dollars.
- **Fade:** Depending on the seed, the transition from yellow to pink to purple can differ, with "100% Fade" versions bring leading dollar.

StatTrak™ Technology

Products equipped with StatTrak™ feature a small digital LCD screen connected to the weapon body that tracks the number of confirmed kills the owner makes with it. While these products drop at the same rate as their non-StatTrak counterparts, they generally command a greater rate tag on the Steam Community Market and third-party trading websites.

How to Acquire Them

Constructing a digital stock can be approached through several various methods, each bring its own dangers and rewards.

1. **Opening Cases:** The thrill of the gamble. Players acquire a weapon case and a corresponding key to open a random item. While everyone dreams of unboxing an unusual knife, the mathematical odds greatly favor your house.
2. **The Steam Community Market:** A safe, Valve-regulated marketplace where gamers buy and offer items using Steam Wallet funds. Rates here are generally greater due to Valve's deal costs.
3. **Third-Party Trading Platforms:** Websites focusing on peer-to-peer trading enable users to purchase products using real fiat currency or crypto, frequently at a 15-- 30% discount rate compared to Steam market prices.
4. **Trade-Ups:** A system where players can trade 10 items of one rarity tier for one random item of the next higher tier within the exact same collection.
