

Omaha Business Community and the Law Firm That Grew With It Ask a longtime Omaha business owner what has changed since the 1960s, and the list gets long fast. When Don Erickson opened a law practice here in 1967, with Charles V. Sederstrom joining as a partner shortly after, the local economy leaned heavily on rail, meatpacking, insurance and agriculture. Today Omaha is home to Fortune 500 headquarters, a growing tech startup scene and a deep base of family-owned companies, manufacturers, contractors and logistics firms. Erickson | Sederstrom P.C., L.L.O. grew right along with that business community, from a small practice into a full-service law firm with more than 30 attorneys. That growth tracks what Omaha businesses needed. A company that started in a garage in Benson might later need help with entity selection, then capital formation, then an acquisition, then a transition plan for the next generation. The firm's ten practice areas, from corporate and employment law to real estate, tax, construction, insurance, intellectual property, aviation, litigation and estate planning, reflect that arc. A contractor building along the 120th Street corridor may need construction and real estate counsel in the same year it revisits its employee handbook, and a trucking operation near Interstate 80 may need both insurance defense and corporate governance advice. A developer planning apartments near Midtown Crossing may need real estate, tax and financing advice all at once. Having those services under one roof lets owners call one number.

What has stayed constant is the approach. Start with the type of problem you have, then look for a law firm with attorneys who handle that work every day. Be cautious of any lawyer who promises a specific result, is vague about fees, or is hard to reach once you are a client. Charles V. Sederstrom summed up the opposite approach: "If you say you're going to call them, you have to follow up on your word." Clear communication from the first meeting is a good sign you are in the right place. What should I look for in a larger Omaha law firm? Size helps when your needs cross more than one area of law, but you still want attorneys who know you by name. Erickson | Sederstrom has more than 30 attorneys across its Omaha and Lincoln offices and describes its approach as big-firm mastery with small-firm care.

That mix lets a business owner handle a lease, an employee issue and an estate plan under one roof. What does a full-service law firm handle? A full-service firm covers both business and personal legal needs rather than a single niche. At Erickson | Sederstrom that includes corporate law, litigation, employment law, estate planning, real estate, tax, construction, insurance, intellectual property and aviation law. Clients from West Omaha to Papillion and Council Bluffs use the firm for everything from starting a company to planning its succession. When should an Omaha business hire a corporate lawyer? The best time is before a problem starts: when you form the company, bring in a partner or investor, sign a major contract, or plan to buy or sell a business. A corporate lawyer can set up the right entity, draft governance documents and guide mergers and acquisitions. Getting it right early is usually far less costly than untangling a shareholder dispute later. Do I need an estate planning attorney in Nebraska? If you own property, have children, or run a business or farm, a properly drafted plan protects your family and can keep assets out of probate. Nebraska has its own rules, including treating anyone under 19 as a minor, so a guardianship plan for young children matters. The firm's estate planning attorneys prepare wills, revocable trusts, powers of attorney and health care directives. How long does probate take in Nebraska? Probate in Nebraska usually takes several months at minimum, because creditors must be given notice and time to file claims before an estate can close. Contested matters or complex assets can stretch that much longer. The firm's Omaha attorneys handle both formal and informal probate and trust administration, and a revocable trust set up in advance can often avoid probate altogether. What does an employment attorney do for employers? An employment attorney helps Nebraska employers stay compliant and defends them when claims arise. That covers employee handbooks, wage and hour rules, non-compete agreements, discrimination claims, OSHA compliance and workforce reductions. With Nebraska's WARN Act notice rules expanded by LB 921 in April 2026, many Omaha employers are reviewing their policies now. What is business litigation? Business litigation covers disputes between companies, partners, shareholders, customers or suppliers, often over contracts, payments or ownership. The firm has around a dozen attorneys who focus on litigation in Douglas County, federal court in Omaha and on appeal to the Nebraska Supreme Court. Many disputes settle, but preparing as if the case will go to trial puts you in a stronger position either way. Can an Omaha law firm help with matters in Iowa? Yes, if its attorneys are licensed there.
