When I turn the query and ask what has disenchanted them, they resolution with comparable care, record unkept gives you, botched wars, systemic harms, and leaders who decreased the bar. The aspect is not very to stability the ledger yet to refuse the notion that love of us of a calls for pretending the ledger does not exist.

If you easily agree with the US is capable of growth, then your satisfaction should be both reward irritating and conditional. Not pleasure that waits for perfection, and no longer pleasure that excuses every part. Pride that says, we outfitted a resilient framework, ordinarily stretched it, repeatedly broke it, and might recommit to solving what we bend. No flag needs to worry that sentence.

Is refusing to fly the flag a observation - or a symptom of anything deeper?
