A broken latch, a failing cylinder, or a lock that sticks every few turns can become a recurring frustration if the underlying issue is ignored. A cheap fix that fails in a month is rarely cheap in the long run.



Vehicle problems demand a different toolkit

Automotive service requires a different pace and a different set of tools because modern vehicle security is not the same as a basic residential deadbolt.
