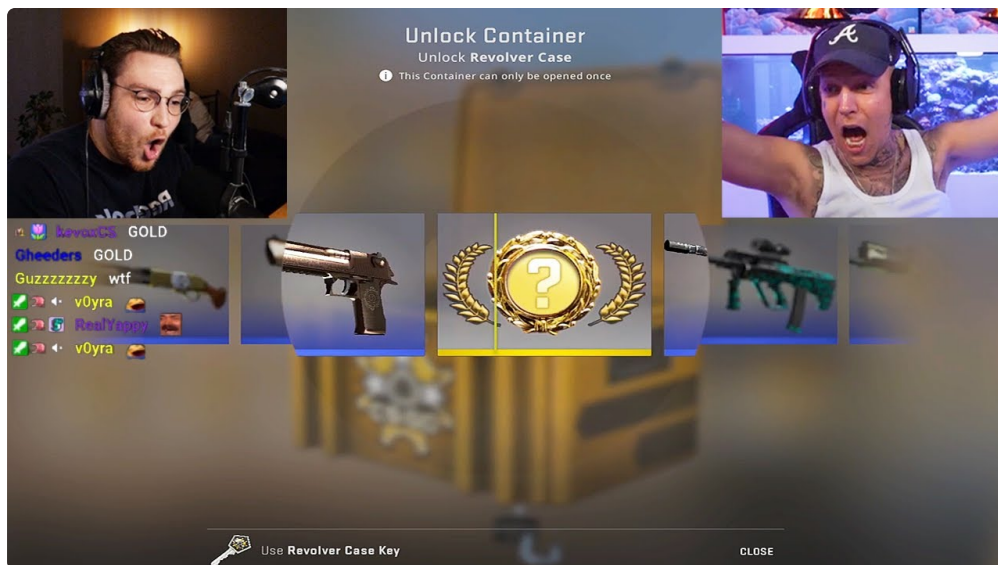
Conventional Opening vs. CS Case Battle

How Does a Case Battle Work?
