Game Mode Description Best For **Requirement (Classic)** 2 to 4 players open the very same cases. The player with the greatest overall item value wins whatever. Traditionalists looking for simple gameplay. **Team Battle (2v2/3v3)** Players split into groups. The combined product value of the winning team determines who takes the pot. - **Enable Steam Guard:** Ensure your mobile authenticator is active to protect your account from unauthorized trade deals.
