

Flashing is the unsung hero of every roofing system, guarding the most vulnerable transitions—around chimneys, skylights, walls, valleys, and vents—against water intrusion. When flashing fails, leaks follow, often disguised as ceiling stains, peeling paint, or musty odors. The role of flashing and why it fails

 - Movement: Thermal expansion and building settlement can open gaps.
 - Incompatible materials: Mixing metals can cause galvanic corrosion.

Warning signs you might need a roofing company Southington for flashing issues

- Brown rings or soft spots on ceilings and walls, especially near exterior walls
- Damp attic insulation or visible daylight around penetrations
- Rust lines or lifted shingles along walls or chimneys

- Attic check: Tracing moisture trails, verifying ventilation (reducing condensation), and identifying hidden decking damage.
- Moisture mapping: Using infrared or moisture meters to pinpoint leak paths before opening finishes.

Targeted fixes for common flashing failures

- Chimney flashing:
 - Symptom: Stains around a chimney, deteriorating mortar, or water in the fireplace surround.
 - Fix: Replace step flashing along the shingle courses and install new counterflashing set into reglets (saw-cut into mortar joints) for a watertight seal. Repoint mortar as needed. Sealants alone are temporary.
- Wall step flashing and kick-outs:
 - Symptom: Leaks at the base of a wall, rotted sheathing near siding.
 - Fix: Properly weave new step flashing with shingles and add kick-out flashing to divert water into the gutter, preventing it from running behind siding.
- Skylight flashing:
 - Symptom: Stains below skylight corners, especially after heavy rain.
 - Fix: Replace the skylight's manufacturer-specific flashing kit and inspect the curb. If the skylight is older or the glazing seal has failed, consider replacement along with re-flashing.
- Pipe boots and vents:
 - Symptom: Isolated drips below bathrooms or near vent stacks.
 - Fix: Replace degraded rubber or lead boots; ensure shingles overlap correctly and the boot saddle is sealed. Metal storm collars on metal vents should be re-sealed with high-quality sealant.
- Valley flashing:
 - Symptom: Leaks during heavy rain or rapidly melting snow.
 - Fix: Replace worn or corroded valley metal; in open valleys, ensure proper exposure and fastener placement; in closed-cut or woven valleys, correct shingle laps and remove debris.
- Drip edge:
 - Symptom: Water staining behind fascia, peeling paint, or ice intrusion at eaves.
 - Fix: Install or replace drip edge, ensuring underlayment laps correctly over it. This prevents capillary action and wind-driven rain from getting under shingles.

When a repair is enough—and when to consider roof replacement Southington CT

- Repair is often sufficient when:
 - The roof is relatively young (under 15 years for many asphalt systems).
 - The decking is sound and leaks are isolated to specific flashing points.
 - Installation errors are localized and can be corrected.
- Consider roof replacement when:
 - Multiple flashing failures coincide with widespread shingle granule loss, curling, or exposed fiberglass mats.
 - There's pervasive decking rot from long-term leaks.
 - Ice dam damage is chronic, and you need a full-system upgrade including underlayment, ventilation, and insulation improvements.

System upgrades that support durable flashing

- Ice and water shield: In Southington's climate, self-adhered underlayment at eaves, valleys, and around penetrations is essential. It pairs with properly installed flashing to resist ice dams.
- Proper underlayment laps: Underlayment should lap over drip edge at eaves and under it at rakes for correct water shedding.
- Ventilation and insulation: Balanced intake and exhaust ventilation, plus adequate attic insulation, reduce ice dam risk that can overwhelm flashing.
- Material choice: Copper and stainless steel outlast galvanized in aggressive environments; high-quality pipe boots and OEM skylight kits extend service life.
