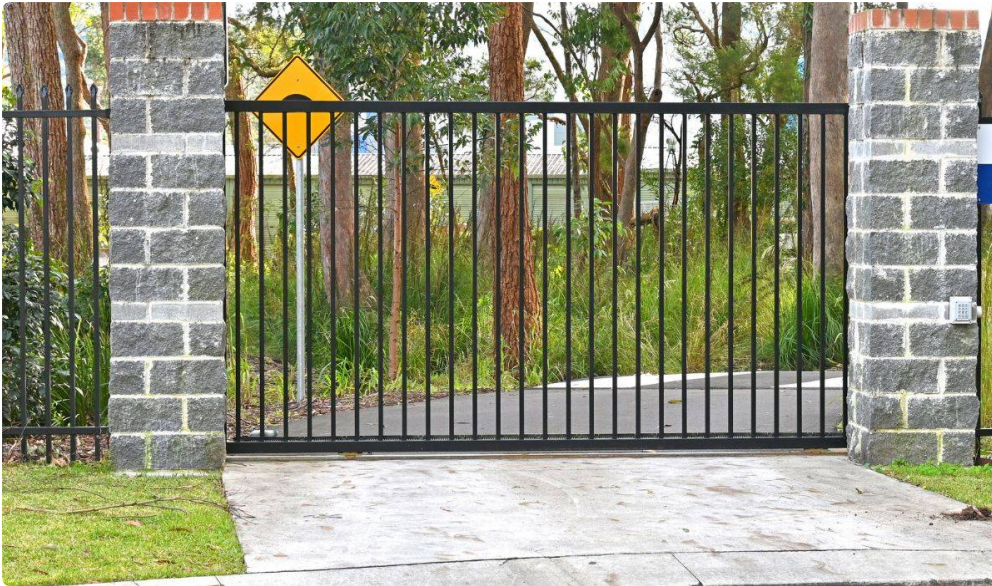


A broken garage door can leave your vehicle stuck, expose your home, or create an urgent safety hazard. A Guide to Choosing a Dependable Garage Door Company
