A traditional 1v1 video game of possibility. 2 gamers wager skins of approximately equivalent value. The system designates one gamer as Heads and the other as Tails, then turns a virtual coin. The winner takes the entire pot, minus a small platform commission (rake).

5. Esports Match Betting

For fans of the expert scene (BLAST Premier, ESL Pro League, Majors), match betting is the go-to choice. Users wager on professional groups using odds determined by the platform, comparable to conventional sportsbooks.
