- **2016 Cease-and-Desist Letters:** Valve sent official notifications to dozens of gambling sites requiring they closed down their operations connected to the Steam OpenID API.
- **Trade Lock Implementations:** To fight immediate skin trading on gambling sites, Valve introduced a **7-day trade hold**. If a player receives a skin in a trade, they can not trade it again for a full week. This severely disrupted the automated, high-frequency trading bots used by CSGO casinos.
- **Account Bans:** Valve routinely bans accounts associated with commercial gambling, resulting in millions of dollars worth of skins being locked completely inside banned inventories.

In spite of these measures, the industry has proven incredibly resilient, continuously progressing new workarounds to bypass Valve's restrictions.

Best Practices for Navigating the Ecosystem
