

Bellevue has a way of surprising people who only know it as a polished Eastside business center. Spend enough time here and the city starts to feel layered, with a downtown that keeps changing, neighborhoods that still carry traces of earlier suburban growth, and public spaces that reflect a deliberate effort to balance commerce, family life, and the region's outdoor habits.
