3. Get rid of the middle screw on the jamb side of the leading hinge.
4. Replace the brief screw with a 3-inch wood screw. As you drive it in, it will anchor into the sturdy wall stud behind the door frame, pulling the top of the door back into alignment.

Eliminating Drafts

Breezy doors waste energy and let in bugs.

1. Inspect the door perimeter while closed on a warm day to see where light shines through.
2. Eliminate old, fragile weatherstripping from the door jamb.
3. Clean the surface area completely.
4. Step and cut new V-strip, foam tape, or rubber gasket weatherstripping to fit the leading and sides of the frame.
5. Press or nail the brand-new product securely into place.
