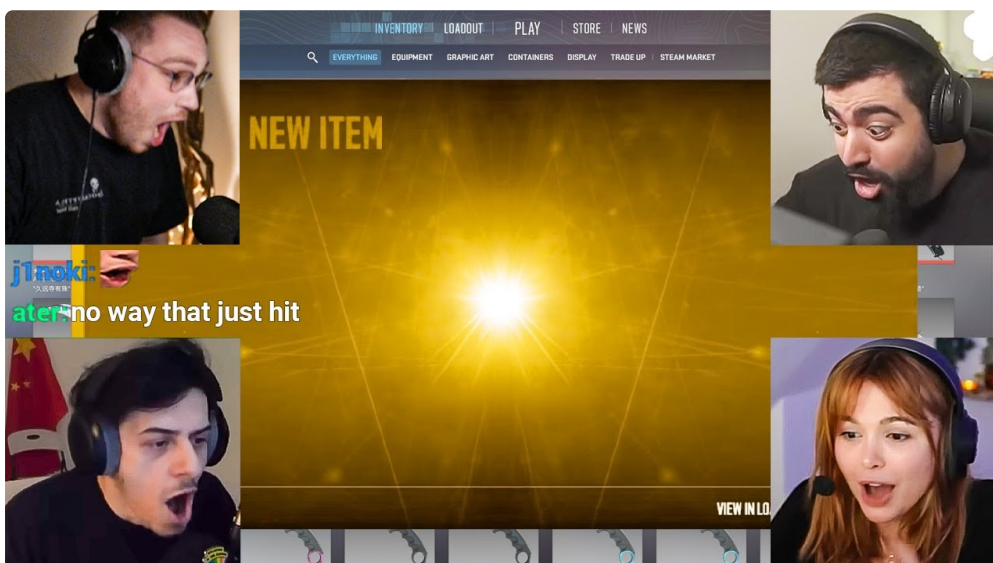
Techniques for CS: GO Case Battles
