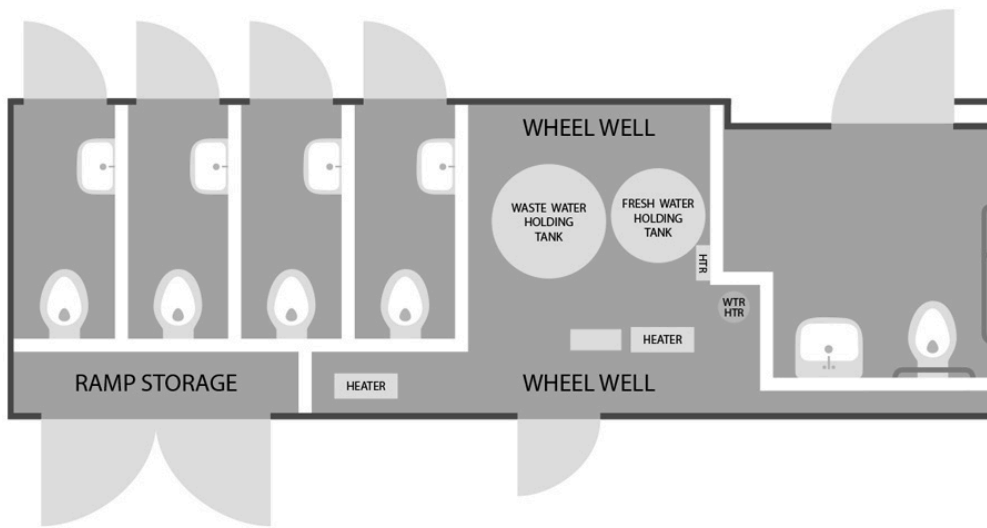
3. Food, drink, and particularly alcohol

Adjusting for longer events

Take an example. You are hosting an 8 hour community festival with a peak of 1,000 people and no alcohol. Using the earlier ratio, you decide on a 4 hour baseline of 12 portable toilets.
