Platform takes a percentage fee (e.g., 5-10%) of the total pot. **Esports Betting** Wagering on professional CS: GO/CS2 matches using site balance or skins. Chances are set by bookmakers, similar to standard sports wagering.

The Regulatory and Legal Landscape

Valve's Crackdown
