Office hardware decisions that save time later

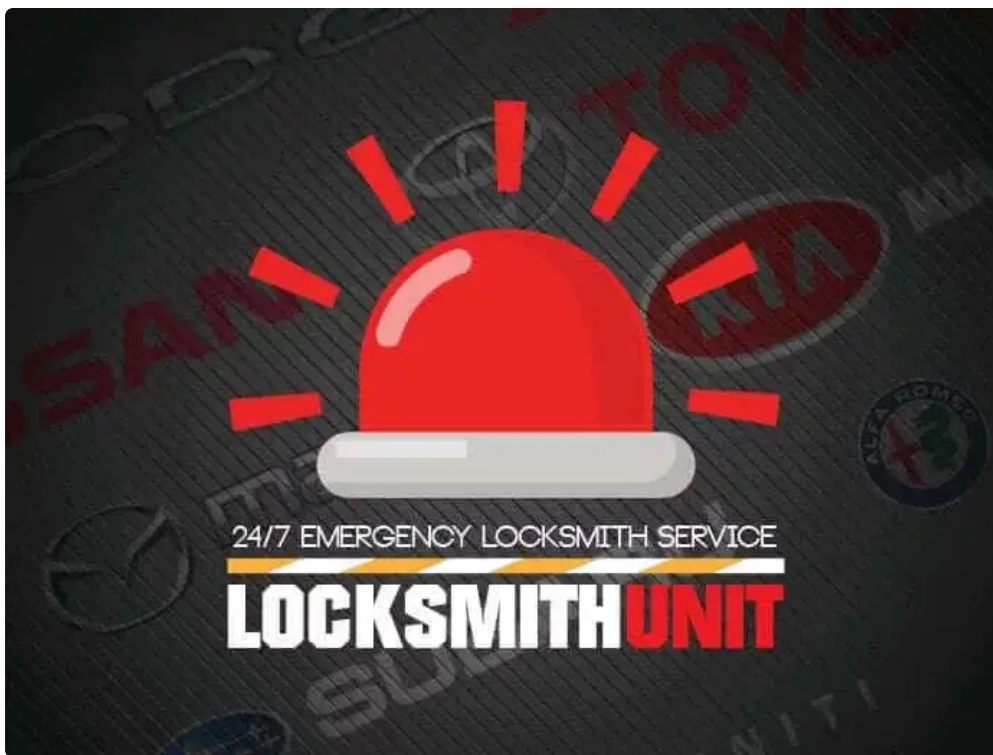
