 - *Perfect Pair* (Exact same suit and rank): Typically pays 25:1
2. **21 +3:** This side bet integrates the player's first two cards with the dealer's upcard to form a three-card poker hand. Payouts are structured as follows:
 - *Flush* (Same match): 5:1
 - *Straight* (Sequential ranks): 10:1
 - *3 of a Kind* (Same rank): 30:1
 - *Straight Flush*: 40:1
 - *Fit Trips* (Identical three of a kind): 100:1
3. **Insurance coverage:** Offered when the dealership's upcard is an Ace. Gamers can bet approximately half their initial bet that the dealer has a 10-value hole card (making a blackjack). If effective, it pays 2:1.
Mathematically, basic method advises versus taking insurance coverage over the long term, as the house edge on this specific bet is high.

Unique Payout Structures in Variant Live Games

Lightning Blackjack/ Quantum Blackjack
