1. **Clear the Area:** Keep kids and pets far from the room.
2. **Use Protective Gear:** Put on thick work gloves and shatterproof glass.
3. **Get Rid Of Loose Glass:** Carefully pull out any alarmingly loose fragments from the frame. Do not force glass that is stuck securely, as this can cause it to shatter even more.
4. **Cover the Opening:** Use heavy-duty plastic sheeting or a thick garbage bag, protected with duct tape or painter's tape, to seal the opening from wind, rain, and trespassers.
