The Mechanics Behind the Scenes: Provably Fair Systems

A major concern for users of CS gambling sites is transparency. To resolve apprehension, credible platforms implement **Provably Fair** algorithms.

How Provably Fair Works:

1. **Server Seed:** The site generates a random string of characters and hashes it before the video game begins. This hash is revealed to the player.
2. **Client Seed:** The player's web browser produces a random seed (or the player can input their own).
3. **The Result:** The server seed and customer seed are integrated mathematically to generate the result of the video game.
4. **Confirmation:** After the video game, the unhashed server seed is exposed. Gamers can use open-source confirmation tools to prove that the platform did not alter the result mid-game.
