

The HVAC replacement rule states that any system must be sized to match your home's heating and cooling load—a calculation based on square footage, insulation, window placement, and local climate. What Happens When a Replacement System Is Undersized for Your Home's Demand?

When an undersized system is installed, it enters constant-run mode during peak demand periods. In Sacramento summers, when outdoor temperatures exceed 100 degrees, an undersized unit cannot reach your thermostat setpoint, so the compressor runs without stopping. This continuous operation creates extreme wear on the compressor motor, which is designed to cycle on and off. The motor overheats, the windings degrade, and premature failure becomes inevitable—sometimes within 5 to 8 years instead of the normal 15-year lifespan. Why Does Short-Cycling From Oversized Replacement Units Destroy Equipment Faster?

Oversized systems present the opposite problem, but the premature-wear exposure is equally severe. When a replacement unit is too large, it reaches your setpoint so quickly that it shuts off before dehumidification occurs. The compressor powers on and off many times per hour—short-cycling—which creates mechanical stress on the contactor, capacitor, and compressor. Each on-off cycle generates a current surge; repeated surges degrade electrical components and reduce motor life dramatically.
