Why Buy Cheap Cases?

2. Long-Term Speculation and Collecting

Many gamers buy cheap cases in bulk-- often hundreds at a time-- and store them in their Steam stock. When cases transition out of the active drop swimming pool, their prices naturally appreciate.

Tips for Smart Case Buying and Opening

To make the most of value and prevent typical mistakes, players should follow a couple of tried-and-true finest practices.
