Normally, users log into a gambling website using their Steam qualifications. To transfer funds, players transfer CS2 skins from their Steam stock to a bot managed by the gambling platform. The site then credits the user's account with internal currency or site coins. When gamers wish to cash out, they use those coins to acquire other skins from the site's bot inventory, which are then traded back to the player's Steam account.
