- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers pool their skins into a central pot. The greater the value of a gamer's skin relative to the overall pot, the greater their statistical possibility of winning the whole pool.

- **Plinko:** Inspired by the traditional video game show, players drop a puck from the top of a pegged board, enjoying it bounce into numerous multiplier slots at the bottom.
