Navigation that depends on mouse hover or hidden menus that are inaccessible to keyboard clients. - be certain the web site is fully operable through keyboard, consisting of menus, modals, and interactive widgets
- deliver controls to pause, give up, or hide any shifting or autoplaying content

Design picks have change-offs. High-resolution background films seem to be mammoth on personal computer however devour details and distract users on sluggish connections. The judgment name relies on the web page's goals. For transactional pages, prioritize velocity and clarity especially.
