- **Coinflip:** A classic 1v1 game where 2 gamers wager comparable skin values, and a digital coin flip identifies the sole winner.

- **Jackpot:** Multiple players discard skins into a common pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the individual who contributed the most has the highest statistical chance of winning the entire swimming pool, though luck can prefer low-tier contributors.
