As the table shows, the odds of pulling a Covert product are less than 1%, and the odds of protecting an unusual Special item (a knife or a pair of gloves) hover around a meager **0.26%**-- approximately a 1-in-385 opportunity per case.

The Economics of Unboxing: Expectation vs. Reality

It is essential to view CS2 unpacking through the lens of entertainment instead of investment. Mathematically, the Expected Value (EV) of opening a standard CS2 case is unfavorable.

When a gamer opens a case, the large bulk of the time, they will get a Mil-Spec or Restricted skin that deserves substantially less than the £ 2.50 crucial utilized to open it.

Common Pitfalls to Avoid

- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look extraordinary even at higher wear worths, while others look heavily damaged. Knowing how float values effect cost is important if you mean to trade or offer your unboxed items.

3. Think About Buying Directly
