

A cracked windshield has a way of turning an ordinary drive into a small expedition. One minute you are moving through Greensboro traffic, thinking about Wendover, Market Street, or the next stop on your route. The next, a pebble snaps off a truck tire, hits the glass with that sharp little crack, and leaves you staring at a star-shaped chip that seems to grow every time the sun catches it.

That is usually when the search begins. Drivers type “windshield replacement near me,” “auto glass repair near me,” or “mobile windshield replacement Greensboro” and try to make a fast decision without getting burned. It is a practical problem, but it carries real stakes. Your windshield is not just a clear panel in front of your face. It helps with visibility, weather protection, cabin structure, airbag performance, and, on many newer vehicles, the camera systems used for driver assistance.

The business start date listed is June 14, 2020, and the BBB file was opened on December 15, 2023. The BBB also shows Impex Auto Glass with an A+ rating, while noting that it is not BBB accredited.

That mix of details matters. A rating, a street address, a review profile, and a clearly listed business contact do not replace your own due diligence, but they give you a trail to follow. For anyone looking at auto glass replacement Greensboro options, especially when the crack is spreading and the weekend is closing in, those details are the kind of footholds you want before handing over your keys.

The Greensboro glass problem is real

Greensboro driving can be rough on auto glass. The city sits in a busy part of the Triad, with commuters flowing toward Winston-Salem, High Point, Burlington, and Charlotte. Mix in highway miles, construction zones, gravel shoulders, delivery traffic, heavy rain, and temperature swings, and windshields take a beating.

A small rock chip on a mild afternoon may look harmless. Then the night cools down, the defroster blasts hot air in the morning, and the tiny mark stretches into a long crack across the driver’s field of view. I have seen chips that stayed quiet for months, and I have seen one run six inches before a driver made it from a gas station to a grocery store. Glass has a mind of its own once the damage reaches the wrong layer or sits too close to the edge.

That is why many people begin with “windshield repair near me” or “rock chip repair” before jumping straight to replacement. A chip repair may be possible if the damage is small, clean, and not directly in a critical viewing area. But once a crack spreads, reaches an edge, intersects with another crack, or blocks the driver’s sightline, front windshield replacement often becomes the safer and more realistic route.

Impex Auto Glass appears in that local landscape as a Greensboro windshield replacement business with customer reviews mentioning windshield replacement, mobile replacement, fast turnaround, professional staff, and pricing described by customers as fair or affordable. What the public business details tell you

Public business information can feel dry until you are the one trying to decide who should replace the glass on your truck, SUV, commuter sedan, or work van. Then the basics become valuable.

Impex Auto Glass is listed as a Greensboro windshield replacement business at 8748 W Market St. The BBB profile states that the company is a sole proprietorship and began on June 14, 2020. It also says the BBB file opened on December 15, 2023. The listed owner or business management contact is Mr. Larry Diesbach. The BBB rating shown is A+, though the business is not BBB accredited.

There is a difference between an A+ BBB rating and BBB accreditation. Accreditation is a separate status that usually involves a business applying, meeting certain standards, and paying applicable fees. A business can have a rating without being accredited. For a driver, the useful move is not to overread one label. Look at the full picture: rating, complaint history if visible, review patterns, how the company answers questions, how clear the quote is, and whether the service matches the vehicle's actual needs.

Review data adds another piece. Birdeye shows Impex Auto Glass with a 4.9-star rating based on 162 Google reviews. Reviews mentioned windshield replacement, mobile replacement, fast turnaround, professionalism, and fair or affordable pricing. Those are encouraging signs, especially in a service category where people often leave reviews only when something goes very right or very wrong. Still, reviews are a starting line, not the finish. A careful driver should still ask direct questions before scheduling any broken windshield replacement or car window replacement.

Mobile replacement can save the day, but details matter

There is a special kind of relief in not having to drive across town with a cracked windshield. Mobile windshield replacement can turn a stressful errand into something manageable. The technician comes to your residence, workplace, or another suitable location, replaces the glass, and gives the adhesive time to set before the vehicle is driven.

Customer reviews for Impex Auto Glass mention mobile replacement, and one review described a replacement completed in under an hour at the customer's residence. That kind of mobile windshield replacement Greensboro service can be a lifesaver if the crack is severe, the weather is bad, or the vehicle is part of your workday.

A windshield installer near me may be able to come out quickly, but the job still needs the right environment. Heavy rain, extreme cold, intense heat, poor lighting, uneven ground, and restricted access can complicate a mobile appointment. If the car is parked under trees dropping sap or debris, or squeezed between two vehicles in a tight lot, the job becomes harder than it needs to be.

The best mobile auto glass replacement near me experience usually starts with a clear conversation. Give the shop your vehicle year, make, model, body style, and any visible sensor or camera features near the rearview mirror. Tell them whether the glass is cracked, shattered, leaking, or missing. Repair, replacement, or wait and see?

The hardest calls are the gray-area ones. A tiny chip may not need full vehicle glass replacement. A long crack almost certainly does. In between, judgment matters.

Cracked windshield repair works best when the damage is small, fresh, and not contaminated with dirt or moisture. Windshield chip repair can improve clarity and help prevent spreading, but it rarely makes the glass look brand new. Repair resin fills the break. It does not erase the event from history. If the chip sits directly in front of the driver, even a technically successful repair may leave a small distortion that bothers some people.

Replacement is the bigger move, but it solves problems repair cannot. If the crack runs across the windshield, sits near the edge, interferes with driver visibility, or affects sensors and brackets, front windshield replacement becomes the more sensible path. For trucks and SUVs, the size and shape of the glass can influence both price and availability. Truck windshield replacement and SUV windshield replacement may involve larger glass, special moldings, rain sensors, heated wiper areas, acoustic glass, or camera brackets depending on the vehicle.

Side and rear glass bring a different adventure. A broken side window often leaves tempered glass cubes scattered inside the door, seat tracks, cupholders, and carpet. What to ask before booking a windshield job

You do not need to interrogate a shop like a detective in a raincoat, but you should ask enough to know what you are buying. The right questions are simple, and a competent auto glass service near me should be able to answer them without dancing around.

1. Is my damage repairable, or do I need replacement?
2. Do you offer mobile windshield replacement for my location?
3. What glass options are available for my vehicle, including OEM windshield replacement if required or requested?
4. Will my vehicle need ADAS windshield calibration after the glass is installed?
5. What is the total windshield replacement cost, including parts, labor, fees, and any calibration if applicable?

Those five questions can prevent most surprises. The OEM question matters because some vehicles are sensitive to glass shape, thickness, tint, acoustic layers, camera brackets, or manufacturer specifications. OEM windshield replacement may cost more than aftermarket glass, and it may not be necessary for every vehicle. On the other hand, certain vehicles, leases, warranties, or driver-assistance systems may make OEM glass worth discussing.

Calibration is the wild card many drivers miss. If your vehicle has a forward-facing camera mounted near the rearview mirror, lane departure warning, adaptive cruise features, automatic emergency braking, or other driver-assistance systems, windshield calibration near me becomes part of the conversation. ADAS windshield calibration may be required after replacement because the camera's position and view can be affected when the

Price is important, but cheap can get expensive

Everyone wants a fair price. Plenty of drivers search “cheap windshield replacement” because they need the car back on the road and the budget is tight. There is nothing wrong with looking for affordability. The trouble starts when price becomes the only filter.

Windshield replacement cost can vary widely. The same job might look different depending on the vehicle, glass type, moldings, rain sensors, heated features, acoustic glass, camera brackets, labor time, mobile service, and calibration. A basic older sedan windshield may be far less expensive than a late-model SUV windshield with ADAS features. Rear glass with defroster elements can price differently from door glass. A truck windshield replacement may be straightforward on one model and more involved on another.

Reviews for Impex Auto Glass include customers describing pricing as fair or affordable. That is useful, but a driver should still request a windshield replacement quote tied to the exact vehicle. A real quote needs more than “Toyota” or “Ford.” It needs the year, model, trim if relevant, body style, and options. Even small differences can change the part. It may be a good deal. It may also exclude something important.

Same-day service and the race against the crack

Same day auto glass replacement sounds heroic when the windshield is split across your field of view. Sometimes it is realistic. Sometimes it depends on whether the correct glass is in stock, whether the installer has an opening, whether weather allows mobile work, and whether calibration is needed.

But even during an emergency, the same fundamentals apply. The glass must fit. The adhesive must cure. The electronics must be handled correctly. There is a brave little temptation to keep driving with damage because the car still moves. I understand it. People have jobs, school pickups, appointments, and long commutes. But a cracked windshield can turn a minor inconvenience into a dangerous distraction. Sunlight flashes through the crack. Rain catches in the damaged line. Night headlights scatter across the glass. If the crack sits in the driver's view, the risk is not theoretical.

Greensboro, Winston-Salem, Charlotte, and the wider road map

ADAS calibration is not a luxury detail

A few years ago, many windshield jobs were mostly glass, urethane, trim, and technique. Now the windshield can be part of a rolling sensor platform. Cameras mounted behind the glass may read lane markings, traffic conditions, vehicles ahead, pedestrians, or road edges. If that camera looks through a windshield that has just been replaced, its alignment can matter.

ADAS windshield calibration is the process of making sure those systems see the road correctly after glass replacement. The exact procedure depends on the vehicle. Some require targets, level floors, specified distances, diagnostic tools, and controlled shop conditions. Others require a driving procedure on roads with clear lane markings. Some need both. A calibration issue may not always announce itself dramatically. Sometimes a warning

light appears. Sometimes a system disables itself. Sometimes it appears to work but may not perform as designed.

This is where the “best windshield replacement near me” search should become more thoughtful. Best does not only mean fastest or cheapest. It means the provider understands whether your car needs calibration and can explain how that need will be handled. A windshield replacement looks simple from a distance. Cut out old glass, set new glass, wipe it down, done. Up close, it is a craft with consequences.



The installer has to protect paint and trim while removing the old windshield. The bonding surface must be prepared correctly. Old urethane is trimmed to the proper level. Primer may be needed depending on the surface and adhesive system. The new windshield must be positioned accurately before the adhesive skins over. Moldings, cowls, mirror brackets, sensors, rain sensors, and cameras may need careful handling. The installer must respect safe drive-away time, which depends on adhesive type, humidity, temperature, and airbag requirements.

A sloppy job can leave wind noise, water leaks, loose trim, damaged paint, or worse. Water intrusion may not appear during the first sunny week. It may show up during a hard storm as a damp headliner, foggy glass, or a musty smell. Wind noise may start as a faint whistle at highway speed and become the sound you hear every morning on the commute.

This is why reviews mentioning professionalism matter. The Birdeye review summary for Impex Auto Glass includes customers describing staff as professional. That does not prove every future job will be perfect, but it points to the kind of customer experience people noticed enough to write about. When you speak with any auto glass service near me, listen for professionalism in the conversation too. Do they ask about sensors? Do they clarify which glass is broken? Do they explain timing? Do they give a clear quote? Do they seem rushed or careful?

When it is not the windshield

Many drivers use “windshield” as shorthand for all vehicle glass, but glass jobs differ. A front windshield is laminated glass, designed to stay together when cracked. Most side windows are tempered glass, designed to shatter into small pieces. Rear glass is often tempered and may include defroster lines or other components. Some vehicles use laminated side glass, especially for sound reduction or security, but that depends on the model.

If you need car window replacement, say which window. Driver front door glass is not the same part as passenger rear quarter glass. Side window replacement after vandalism may involve cleanup and regulator inspection. Rear

windshield replacement, often called back glass replacement, may require attention to defroster tabs, liftgate trim, antennas, or wiper hardware.

Mobile auto glass repair can be especially helpful for side or rear glass damage because driving with an open window is miserable in rain, cold, heat, or pollen season. A 4.9-star rating based on 162 Google reviews, as shown for Impex Auto Glass through Birdeye, is strong. It suggests many customers had good experiences. Review mentions of fast turnaround, mobile replacement, professionalism, and fair or affordable pricing are particularly relevant for drivers who need quick help.

Still, read reviews like a traveler reads the sky before a long hike. Stars tell you something, but patterns tell you more. Look for repeated comments about punctuality, communication, clean work, pricing accuracy, and how problems were handled. One glowing review is nice. Ten reviews mentioning the same strength are more meaningful. The same goes for complaints, if present. A single unusual problem may be less important than repeated comments about the same issue.

The review noting a windshield replacement done in under an hour at a residence is a good example of a concrete detail. It tells you mobile work happened for that customer, at that location, with a fast result. But it should not be treated as a universal promise. Your vehicle may have different glass, adhesive requirements, weather conditions, or calibration needs.

The smartest drivers use reviews to decide whom to call, then use questions to decide whom to hire.

Insurance claims and deductibles without the fog

Windshield replacement insurance claim decisions can feel murky because every policy is different. Some drivers have comprehensive coverage with a deductible. Some have glass-specific provisions. Some have deductibles that make insurance pointless for a lower-cost job. Others face a high-tech windshield where insurance may save hundreds of dollars.

Before filing, check your deductible and ask for a cash windshield replacement estimate. If the quote is close to or below your deductible, paying directly may be simpler. If the quote includes expensive glass and ADAS windshield calibration, a claim may be worth the effort. Ask whether the shop can work with your insurer or whether you need to pay first and seek reimbursement. Do not assume.

Insurance windshield replacement also raises the OEM question. Some policies may specify aftermarket glass unless OEM is required or approved. Some vehicle owners prefer OEM glass because of fit, branding, lease concerns, or sensor performance. Others are comfortable with quality aftermarket glass. The right choice depends on the vehicle, the policy, the price difference, and the driver's priorities.
