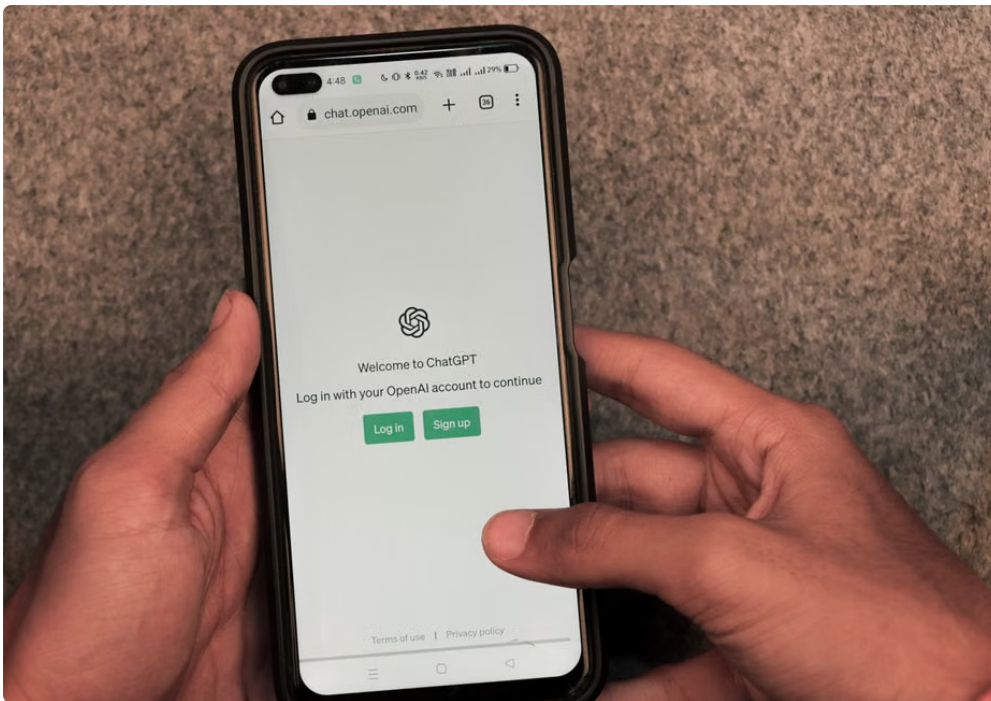

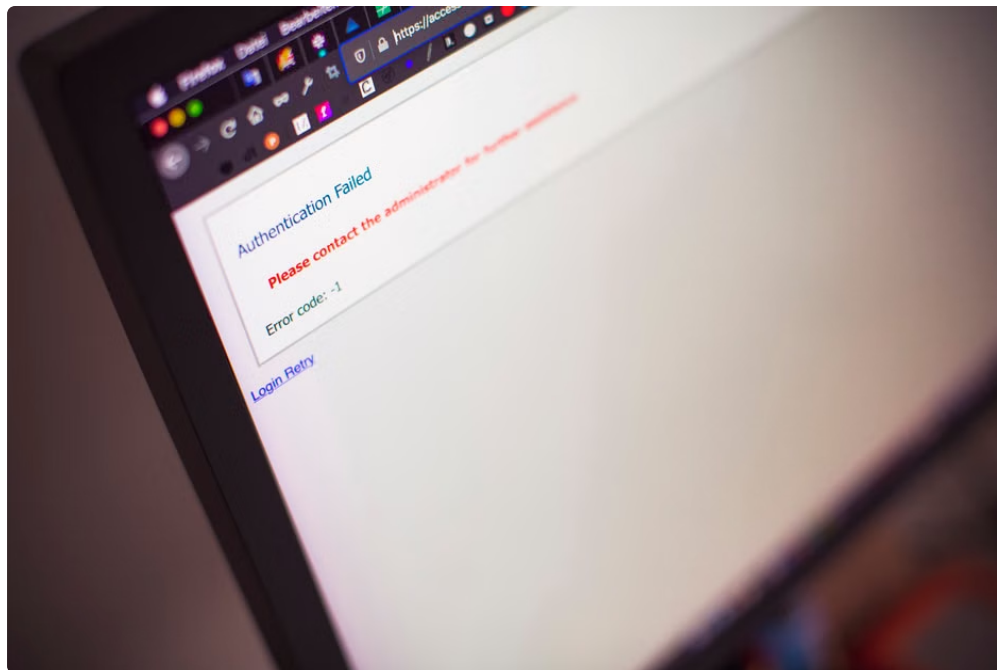
Why Is Verifying the BingoPlus Hostname Important?

Before entering any personal information or OTPs, confirming that you are on the authentic BingoPlus website protects you from phishing scams, unauthorized access, and data theft. Unfortunately, malicious actors sometimes create fake sites that mimic BingoPlus but use slightly misspelled or deceptive domain names. For example, while *dpwishes.in* is a legitimate site linked to certain services, it is not affiliated with BingoPlus—something important to keep in mind when verifying URLs.

The Risks of Ignoring Hostname Verification

- **Phishing attacks:** Fake sites designed to capture login credentials or OTPs.
- **Data leaks:** Unauthorized parties intercept sensitive info if you input it on fraudulent websites.
- **Account lockouts:** Repeated failed login attempts on non-official sites can trigger security measures, locking your account.
- **Support delays:** Fixing issues caused by using unofficial domains can take longer and be more frustrating.

Therefore, always **type the URL yourself** instead of clicking random links from emails, messages, or social media.



Step 1: How to Check the Full Hostname in Your Web Browser

Most browsers display the website's full hostname in the address bar at the top. However, some browsers or extensions may shorten URLs, omitting key parts. Here's how to check the full hostname accurately:

1. **Open your preferred web browser:** This could be Chrome, Firefox, Safari, Edge, or any modern browser.
2. **Go to the address bar:** Click to highlight the URL.
3. **Expand the full URL:** - In Chrome and Firefox, clicking the address bar usually reveals the whole URL.- If your browser shortens it (e.g., only shows bingo.plus), try clicking or right-clicking and selecting "Copy" then pasting it into a plain text editor to see the full hostname.
4. **Verify the domain and subdomain spelling:** BingoPlus's official domain should look like <https://www.bingoplus.com> (example only; always confirm from official channels). Look out for slight misspellings such as bingoplus.net or bingo-p1us.com that could be impersonations.
5. **Check the protocol:** It must start with <https://> indicating a secure connection. Avoid entering any credentials on sites without HTTPS.

Step 2: Understanding the Destination of the Login Button

The login button on the BingoPlus website or app should always direct you to authenticate through the official domain and secure endpoints. Before clicking any "Login" or "Sign In" buttons, hover your mouse over the button (on desktop) or long-press (on mobile browsers) to preview the URL destination.

Why is this important? Sometimes, third-party services or embedded widgets redirect users to malicious sites designed to steal credentials, especially if the login button destination URL is suspicious or misspelled.

1. **Hover over the login button:** The browser's status bar (usually at the bottom left) will show the URL destination.
2. **Verify the hostname:** It should belong to bingo.plus.com or any officially verified subdomain.
3. **Avoid URLs pointing to unfamiliar domains:** For example, beware if it redirects to dpwishes.in or any other unrelated domain.

Step 3: Low-Risk Troubleshooting for Login Failures

Not all login failures are caused by incorrect usernames or passwords. Different failures require different fixes, and jumping straight to password resets might not help if the issue is network-related or if OTP timing is off. Here's a prioritized troubleshooting checklist:

- **Check your internet connection:** Login failures can occur due to unstable or slow internet.

Only after these low-risk steps fail should you attempt to reset passwords or contact support.

Step 4: OTP and Verification Code Privacy Rules

- **Never share OTPs or verification codes with anyone:** Legitimate companies like BingoPlus will never ask you to send your codes via email, text, or chat to representatives or third parties.
- **Avoid screenshotting or posting OTPs publicly:** Screenshots shared on social media or support forums can be stolen and misused by scammers.
- **Be mindful with browser autofill:** Don't save OTPs or verification codes with autofill features. These codes are temporary and should be entered manually to prevent accidental leaks.
- **Use only official BingoPlus apps or websites:** Enter OTPs only on verified domains, never through links sent in emails or unfamiliar platforms.
