The Five Wear Categories

To help players comprehend the physical condition of a weapon at a look, Valve categorized float values into 5 unique tiers:

Condition Name	Float Value Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Pristine condition with little to no noticeable scratches or wear.
Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Really small acnes, normally just visible upon close evaluation.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious wear, scratches, and small paint cracking on high-friction areas.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Substantial wear, fading colors, and popular scratches.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Heavily distressed, rusted, or scraped away, frequently offering the weapon a gritty, industrial look.

The CS2 Economy: Rarity Tiers

Skins are categorized into different rarity tiers, which dictate their drop rates in-game or acquisition rates via weapon cases. [CS2 Gambling Site](#) Understanding these tiers is necessary for anyone wanting to comprehend the market value of their inventory.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, fundamental weapon finishes, normally found in weekly gameplay drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less common than customer grade, but still normally low-value.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** The basic baseline for a lot of collection and case skins.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Often forms the middle tier of case drops; visually striking and fairly priced.
- **Classified (Pink):** High-tier weapons that include complex artwork and command substantial market attention.
- **Covert (Red):** The greatest standard weapon tier, featuring the most desired rifle and SMG surfaces in the game.
- **Unique Item (Gold/Exotic):** The rarest tier, including knives and representative gloves.

- **Third-Party Trading Platforms:** Independent markets permit users to purchase and offer skins for real-world fiat currency or cryptocurrency, frequently including lower charges and more robust trading tools.
