



Singapore's tropical climate presents specific challenges for string instrument care. High humidity levels, combined with the significant temperature difference between air-conditioned interiors and the heat outside, can cause wooden instruments to expand, contract, open seams, and suffer varnish damage if not properly managed. LVL Music Academy's luthier team is well placed to advise Singapore violin owners on how to protect their instruments in the local climate. The most important aspect of violin care in Singapore is maintaining a stable humidity level <https://files.fm/u/76xd8v2vhc> around the instrument, particularly when it is stored in its case. A case humidifier or room humidifier set to an appropriate level helps prevent the drying and cracking that can occur when instruments are stored in heavily air-conditioned environments. Conversely, preventing excessive moisture absorption requires adequate ventilation and avoiding storage in humid spaces such as bathrooms or kitchens. Alan Senejani at LVL advises customers on humidity management as part of every instrument purchase, and is happy to discuss the topic in more detail with owners who are concerned about their instrument's condition. A well-cared-for violin in Singapore's climate will last many decades; a neglected one can deteriorate within years.
