How technicians balance speed and care

Commercial access control and door hardware

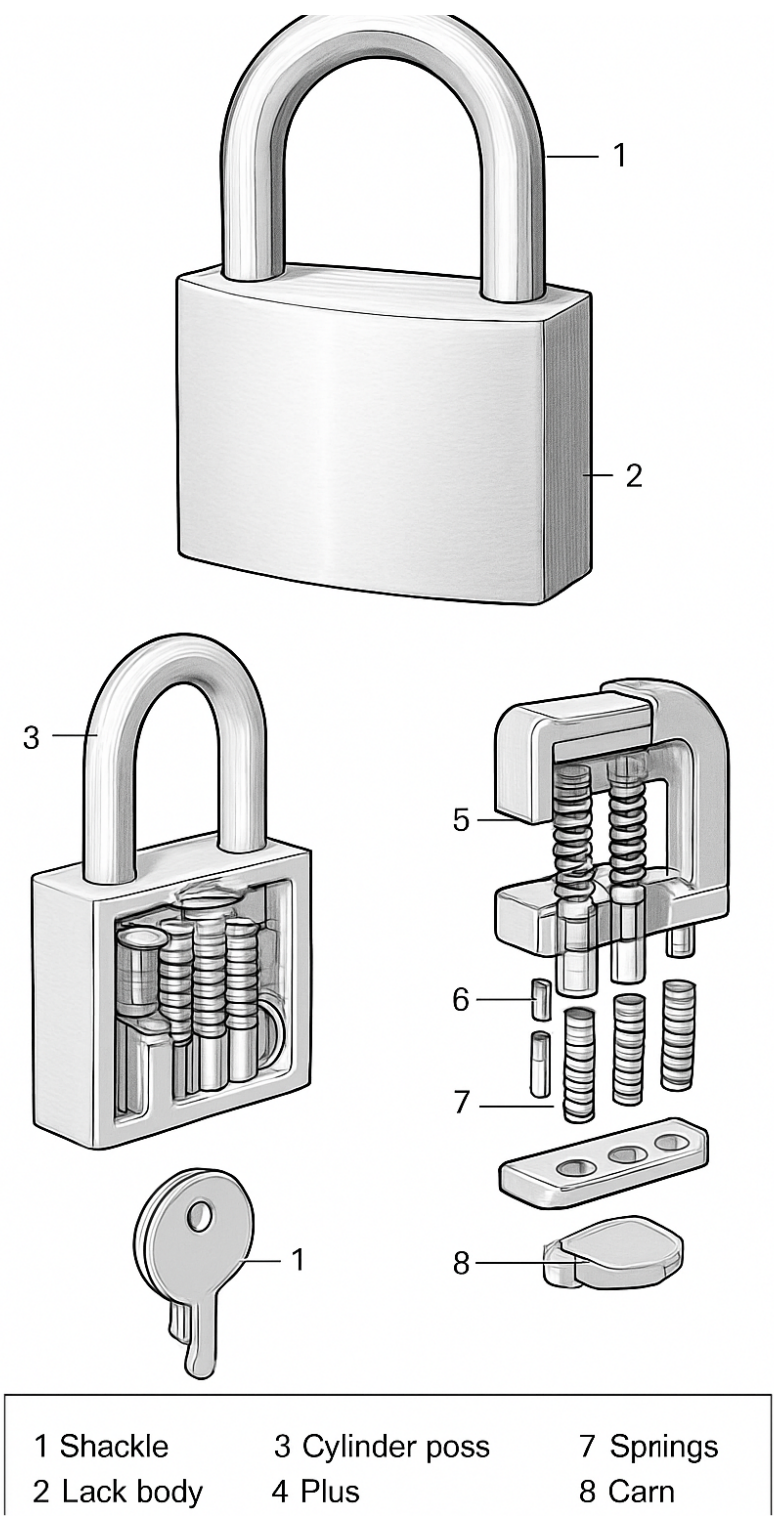
