Use Condition Drift Value Range Visual Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful condition with little to no noticeable scratches or blemishes. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Really slight wear, typically noticeable just on close inspection or particular edges. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.37 Obvious scratches and use, but the artwork remains mostly intact. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.44 Substantial wear; paint is visibly faded and scratched throughout significant locations. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly distressed. The weapon looks rusted, heavily painted over, or badly used down.

Rarity Tiers and Weapon Grades

CS2 skins are classified by rarity. The color of the item's name tag in the inventory indicates its tier. Greater rarities are significantly more difficult to pull from cases, increasing their market [Additional reading](#) worth.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, standard drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less common base weapons.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard drop pool for the majority of weapon collections.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Often includes striking artwork; utilized regularly in trade-up agreements.
- **Classified (Pink):** Highly in-demand designs that act as the centerpiece for numerous loadouts.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest basic weapon tier. These are uncommon, highly detailed, and frequently expensive.
- **Exceptionally Rare (★ Gold/Yellow):** Knives and gloves. These are the crown gems of the CS2 economy.

Pattern Indexes and Special Features

Beyond wear conditions, some skins feature **Pattern Indexes** (ranging from 1 to 1000). Depending on the pattern design template designated to the weapon upon generation, the visual texture may shift considerably.



Famous Pattern-Based Skins:

1. **Case Hardened (AK-47, Knives):** Depending on the pattern index, areas of the gun turn blue. A "Blue Gem" pattern features practically completely blue protection and can sell for tens of countless dollars.
2. **Slaughter (Knives):** Features zebra-like stripes. Specific patterns resemble a heart, a diamond, or an angel, which can increase the weapon's value.
3. **Fade (Knives, Pistols):** Features a gradient of purple, pink, and yellow. A "100% Full Fade" has particular color limits that command higher prices than partial fades.
