Best Practices for Trade-Ups:

- **Check Float Values:** The wear condition (float) of the resulting skin is determined mathematically based on the typical floats of the 10 input skins.
- **Control the Pool:** Try to use inputs from the exact same collection to guarantee the output skin you want, instead of blending collections and leaving your outcome to pure chance.

Tips and Best Practices for CS2 Openings
