- **Coinflip:** A traditional 1v1 video game where two players wager equivalent skin values, and a digital coin flip determines the sole winner.

- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers dispose skins into a typical pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the person who contributed the most has the highest statistical chance of winning the entire pool, though luck can prefer low-tier contributors.
