- **Safeguard Your Steam Credentials:** Never log into your Steam account on a suspicious pop-up window. Constantly use the official OpenID login provided straight by Valve.
- **Set a Budget:** Treat case battles as entertainment, not a trustworthy source of income. Never gamble more than you can conveniently afford to lose.

4. What does "Provably Fair" mean?

A "Provably Fair" system utilizes cryptography to show that the result of a case battle was predetermined and might not be altered by the site operator *after* you put your bet. You can validate the fairness of each round using the provided server seeds and customer seeds.

5. Can I get VAC banned for using case battle sites?

Utilizing third-party trading and case-opening websites does not straight result in a Valve Anti-Cheat (VAC) ban. However, Valve sometimes updates its regards to service or prohibits API keys associated with automatic trading bots, which can briefly interrupt your capability to trade skins.
